ALL PRO DAD (5 times per year)

All Pro Dad provides an opportunity for dads to spend quality time with their children that will strengthen their relationship. The committee offers a breakfast event before school that features a topic, prizes and bonding between dads and students.

BUS DRIVER APPRECIATION

The goal of Bus Driver Appreciation Committee shows appreciation to the individuals who safely transport our students daily. A one time only small gift is created and presented to drivers at the school.

CULTURAL ARTS (year long)

Cultural Arts is responsible for coordinating cultural events. The committee works closely to enrich the curriculum and bring in engaging artists to work with students. This may include assemblies, artwork, literature, or other hands-on experiences.

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (year long)

DEI supports school and community initiatives around diversity, equity and inclusion education. DEI efforts work to promote global citizenship, enhance the curriculum, celebrate DEI, and promote awareness. National & county events and holidays are highlighted. Outreach to parents is also a primary goal.

FALCON FOLLIES (May/ June)

Fulton Elementary School talent show. This event encourages students to showcase their talent in front of a supportive audience full of teachers, peers, parents, and community members. Students form their own groups, audition and perform for 2-3 min on a Friday evening.

FALL FESTIVAL (October)

Fall Festival is a fun family event sponsored by the PTA and held primarily outdoors on the school grounds. The event features games, cakewalk, crafts, prizes, moon bounce, and rock climbing. Many volunteers are required for this event.

FIELD DAY (May)

Field Day is a student event held on school grounds and is an opportunity for students to have fun while learning about fitness. The event features activities promoting fitness including the Monster Run, games, team events, relays and more!

FUNDRAISING (year long)

Working closely with the Executive Board, this role includes identifying and coordinating 2-3 initiatives that will assist the PTA in increasing revenue to fund its student and staff programs and learning.

HOLIDAY SHOPPE (December)

Holiday Shoppe is a fun event for students to purchase inexpensive gifts for their family members during the holiday season. Students learn about budgeting, thinking of others, and shopping all in a small setting at school. Shopping occurs during the school day, as students are accompanied by teachers and volunteers.

INTERNATIONAL NIGHT (February/ March)

International Night celebrates cultural diversity at FES. The educational evening includes displays, food, performances, a Parade of Nations, often featuring 20+ countries. It is typically one of the largest PTA sponsored events. All families are encouraged to participate and attend.

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MEMBERSHIP

The goal of the membership committee is to build an informed, active membership, familiar with the mission, objects, policies, and programs of the PTA. The committee collects membership dues and maintains a current membership list.

PARENTS SOCIAL (year long)

Working closely with the Executive Board, this role includes coordinating 3-4 initiative for parents and guardians to engage with one another in a positive and fun way.

PASSIVE FUNDRAISING (year long)

Persons working on Box Tops for Education, GIANT/Harris Teeter rewards, and Amazon Smile coordinate the shopper rewards programs offered by these companies.

SCHOOL DIRECTORY

This person is responsible for organizing the publication of the annual school directory. Securing local sponsors and donors to advertise is highly encouraged.

SCHOOL SUPPLY KITS (August)

This person is responsible for coordinating the prepackaged school supply kit drive from vendor to delivery to assigned classroom pods. Coordination to obtain the teacher list, perform QA/QC on delivered kits.

SIGN CHANGER

This is a flexible yet very important role to ensure the school sign is changed to contain the most current and accurate important information and upcoming dates.

SPIRIT NIGHT

This person is responsible for coordinating with local restaurants, vendors and others in the community to secure dates where FES families can earn money for the school by dining and/or shopping at the partnering restaurants and stores in our community.

SPIRIT WEAR

This person is responsible for identifying a vendor, creating spirit wear order forms, collecting forms and ordering FES gear, and then ensuring that all orders are distributed to students.

STAFF APPRECIATION

The goal of this committee is to show appreciation to the teachers and staff for their continual hard work and dedication to our children. Often small gifts are given to recognize staff birthdays.

STAFF LUNCHEONS (August/ Teacher Conference)

This person coordinates 2 luncheons during the year, working with outside vendors to provide food and beverages for the staff.
